

TUITION/FEE SCHEDULE Academic Year 2014–15

for International (F-1 Visa) Students

Non-Resident Tuition: As an F-1 visa student, you must enroll full-time; defined as a minimum of 12 units each Fall and Spring semester. Twelve units of "non-resident" tuition cost \$2,244 per semester, or \$4,488 for the Academic Year; plus additional required "fees" listed below.

Note: The International Student F-1 visa is a Non-Immigrant visa category and does not establish in-state "residency" for tuition purposes.

Enrollment Fee: The current enrollment fee is \$46 per unit (as required by the State of California) and is paid by ALL students attending the College. If you enroll in 12 units, you will pay \$552 per semester or \$1104 for the Academic Year— in addition to the non-resident tuition. The Enrollment Fee is subject to periodic/annual change as a result of State legislative action. Any fee change would apply to all California, public community colleges.

HEALTH INSURANCE (Mandatory): International Students must purchase the <u>mandatory group health</u> <u>insurance plan</u> offered by Glendale C.C. at the time of class registration. The insurance will be automatically billed to your student account as part of your Semester tuition/fees payment. Please refer to the "<u>General Information</u>" section of the International Application Form and the International Students web site pages for more details on this group health plan.

<u>Health Services Fee</u>: As a student at Glendale Community College, you are required to pay the student health services fee of \$18 per semester. This is in addition to the above health insurance coverage required of all International students. The College does provide a Health Center.

<u>International Student Activity Fee</u>: Activity Fee of \$25 per semester for International Students Club programming activities both on-campus and off-campus events.

• *Note:* This list does <u>not</u> include all available majors at four-year institutions. If your goal is to transfer (after the Associate Degree and 60 units of credit), you can complete the first two years of Undergraduate coursework at **GCC**. Normally, it takes four years to complete the requirements for the U.S. Bachelor's Degree. [Glendale Community College traditionally has one of the highest "transfer rates" to four-yr. Universities within the California system of community colleges.]



GENERAL INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

for International (F-1) Students

Accreditation: Glendale Community College, founded in 1927, is a comprehensive public community college within the California system of community colleges. The College is fully accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC)—an institutional accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.

Arrival & New Student Orientation: Once a student has been formally accepted and obtained the necessary F-1 student visa, the student may enter the United States 30 days prior to the start of the semester classes. With most U.S. Embassy & Consulate posts overseas, students may obtain the F-1 student visa "stamp" in their passport 120 days prior to the start of the semester. For further U.S. visa information, use the following Web site: www.travel.state.gov/visa/. New students should plan to arrive at Glendale College approximately 3 to 4 weeks prior to the start of the semester—to take advantage of the New Student Orientation Day, placement testing and the advising/registration process for classes. Late arrival may result in very limited class selection. All new students are expected to attend the "Orientation Day" scheduled two weeks before the start of Fall and Spring Semesters. Please Note: The College cannot provide Airport pickup/shuttle services. Students can arrange Airport ground transportation to the Glendale area (approximately one hour) with one of several Airport shuttle van companies (such as: "Super Shuttle"—blue-colored vans) readily available at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). The approximate cost for Super Shuttle services will be\$45 to \$50 USD.

Financial Assistance/Scholarships: Students on the F-1 visa category (as non-residents) are not eligible for U.S. federal government or California State financial aid programs. Students may apply for a very limited number of Glendale scholarships or grants after completing one semester or 12 units of college credit. These awards can be based on academic achievement, major of study and/or financial need.

Finally, a very limited number of part-time jobs (up to 20 hours per week maximum) are sometimes available on campus for International students. No guarantee of part-time employment can be provided by the College.


Guardian Statement: Glendale Community College requires that students <u>under the age of 18</u> have a guardian over the age of 21 living in Los Angeles County. In the event of a personal emergency, accident, illness or incarceration, the State of California will require the signature of a guardian before assistance—such as hospitalization or legal counsel. If you are under the age of 18 at the time of your enrollment, you are required to have your parent submit a signed statement informing Glendale Community College who will be assigned as your legal guardian. The statement must include full name, address, phone number, E-mail and age of the Guardian.

HEALTH INSURANCE (Mandatory, Group Plan): All F-1 International Students (and their eligible F-2 dependents) are required to purchase the group health insurance plan coverage from Glendale Community College at the time of class registration. The insurance premium amount will be billed automatically as part of your overall Semester tuition/fees payment. This group health insurance plan is to protect International Students from the high costs of medical treatment in the U.S. The GCC group plan is administered by the internationally-recognized company, "GGH Benefits," and the insurance coverage and benefits are provided by "Anthem Blue Cross Life & Health Insurance Company." Off-Campus Housing: As with most community colleges in California, Glendale Community College does not provide on-campus housing or dormitory facilities for its students. Students may find a variety of off-campus apartments and housing for rent in the local area. Currently, a one-bedroom apartment in the surrounding Glendale area will rent from \$1,000 to \$1,200+ per month. Costs will vary depending on size and other accommodations. Homestays: Students may also choose to live with an American family as part of a "homestay"/host family option. The International Student Office is pleased to work with the following host family placement company: "International Student Placements" (ISP). The ISP company will make student placements following a screening process of families, houses and area locations. 
